**5. Review of Annual Town Meeting:** This Selectmen's Meeting will be the first following the annual Town Meeting to be held Monday, June 2, 2014 at 6:00 PM. Letter to Montreal, Maine and Atlantic's Successor:** For years, the Railroad has managed a beaver problem along its tracks near the village by opening it up and letting large quantities of water run through to the stream and culvert system which cross Eveleth Hill and runs parallel to Moosehead Lake Road. While railroad maintenance personnel have been cooperative with Greenville PW in letting us know – mostly – before they are to open the flood gates (if you will) they sometimes fail to notify us, and even when they do, there is little we can do to mitigate the damage which comes with the flow. Several buildings along Moosehead Lake Road have been damaged by this flooding, and Eveleth Hill has suffered very minor damage. To address this, I recommend the Board of Selectmen sign a letter to Tom Tardiff, Property Manager and Environmental Officer for the Railroad, and ask for mitigation of this on-going problem.
